## In House Teacher Training On Art Integration In Science



In a series of tailor-made, in-service teacher training programmes, Science Department conducted an inhouse training on Integrating Art in Sciences on 13 July 2024. Ms. Pallavi Sharma (TGT, Science) and Ms. Mamtesh Malik (Art and Craft Teacher) were the resource persons. Key features of the interactive session brought out the difference between Art Education and Art Integration. Several examples were discussed like an animated storyline to explain pollination, use of visual arts like Madhubani / Telangana Paintings to deliver the cultural practices and/or study of force and pressure in Physics, performing arts to explain mathematic concepts of comparisons, origami as an education for paper folding to make various articles that can be later used by students in their science projects. Comic books designed by students to explain cell functions were also displayed. Emphasis was laid on various interesting techniques to be used for teaching concepts in science. Analogy, as a key to make things understood. An hour's training ended at 11:00 A.M. with sharing of ideas among the teachers.
